Our record low was on July 9th with only 47 "Potato Bar" meals served.

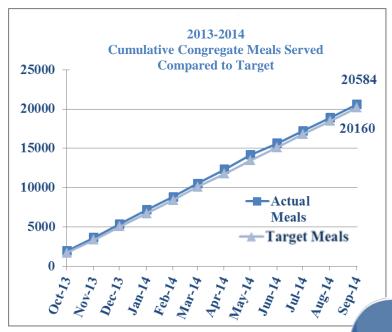
Total # In-House Meals Served

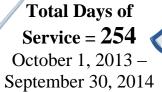

Caring for a Family Member?

Do you or someone in your family provide care for a loved one who is frail, chronically ill or disabled? Surveys reveal that 58% of caregivers help with at least one activity of daily living, like getting dressed, feeding or helping to get out of bed. Furthermore, the average caregiver provides 20.4 hours of care during a 7-day week, 13% of caregivers provide more than 40 hours over the same period of time and around 75% of caregivers were also employed at some time while they were caregiving.

What's it all about?

Our nutrition programs are grant funded by the State of Nevada, Aging and Disability Services Division (ADSD) at a rate of \$2.20 for each meal served in the Terrace dining rooms to adults age 60 and older and at a rate of \$2.50 per meal delivered to homebound adults in the same age range.

We will not refuse to feed any qualified senior based on their ability to pay. Therefore, information regarding individual meal donations is protected as private and confidential.

Food and labor costs to prepare each meal exceeds State of Nevada and Federal grant receipts, and typical operating costs such as utilities, equipment maintenance and program supplies further exceed governmental grants and funding.

Fortunately, we serve a thriving community whose business owners and residents generously support social services for all ages and populations, including our beloved senior adults.

Annual programs and operational costs are supported through a combination of gracious financial gifts, in-kind professional services, recurring fundraising events and diligent volunteers who include: Newmont Mining Corporation and the Newmont Legacy Fund, Elko County, The City of Elko, Barrick Gold of North America, Al Park Petroleum, Konakis Automotive, Elko Raley's, Great Basin College, the EJC Foundation and many more unnamed individuals and small business owners in our community.
