Welcome to April! It may not yet feel like it, but the cold weather is mostly behind us. The historic average low for April is just below freezing, though our area still averages about 3 inches of snow in April; with hope, the April showers will be rain, and not snow. Either way, April is National Pickleball Month, so pick up your paddle and hit the courts! April is also Keep America Beautiful Month. You can help by participating in Clean Up, Green Up on April 26. April also happens to be Scottish-American Heritage Month and National Tartan Day is April 6. In honor of these two celebrations, this month we will discuss a relevant Nevada State Symbol, the State Tartan. The Nevada State Tartan has an official entry in The Scottish Register of Tartans and was codified in 2001. The Tartan is made of 5 colors: Blue, Silver, Red, Yellow, and White. Blue, one of the state colors of Nevada, represents Lake Tahoe and the Mountain Bluebird. Silver, our other state color, represents our state mineral, the granite Sierra Nevadas, the silver in northern Nevada, as well as one of our state nicknames. Red represents the state precious gemstone, the Virgin Valley black fire opal, and the red rock of southern Nevada. Yellow represents sagebrush, our state flower, and the Great



Basin Region in the center of our state. White is for our name, which means “snow-covered” in Spanish. There are another seven (7) specific points of representation within the Nevada Tartan as well, though that would take another paragraph to detail. Feel free to stop in my office and I’ll be happy to go over them in person.

Over the next few months, our new garage will be built. There will be heavy equipment running at times with a construction crew in the area, so please be aware and be cautious when driving near the far end of the parking lot. Our new website is up and running, so please take a minute to look it over. We are still doing some clean-up, though if you see anything incorrect, please let us know. Please continue to make checks out to either ESAP or Elko Senior Center.

Did you know that April is Parkinson’s Awareness Month? The Parkinson Support Center of Northern Nevada has an education series that our Members can participate in. These helpful sessions can be joined via Zoom, saving travel time and expenses. Please see me and I can get you more information.

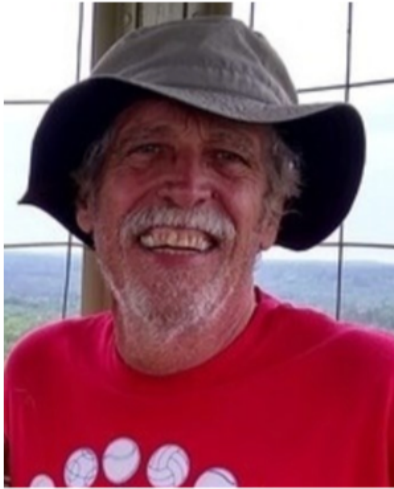

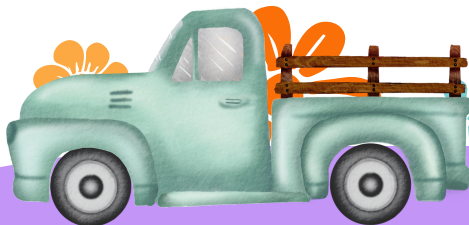
